National Regulations against match fixing in relation to the betting market

Dear Sir or Madam,

With reference to the above-mentioned matter, we would like to turn your attention to the fact that FIFA currently has identified match fixing as one of the biggest threats to the integrity of sports.

FIFA has done a lot to combat match fixing and to protect the integrity of football, e.g. by launching FIFA's subsidiary Early Warning System GmbH which monitors and analyses the sports betting market, is collaborating with national and international authorities and also by focusing on prevention and education, most notably, of players, referees and coaches.

In view of the above and in order to coordinate further activities in relation to the fight against match fixing we invite all FIFA member associations to provide us via fax, mail or e-mail and in one of the four official FIFA languages (English, German, French, Spanish) by 30 November 2012 with the following information:

- List of the current regulations in force against match fixing in relation to the betting market within the Statutes and regulations of your association together with a copy of the relevant provisions/the wording of these regulations;
- List of possible sanctions which can be imposed by your association in case of infringement of a provision intending to prevent match fixing in relation to the betting market together with a copy of the relevant provisions/the exact wording of these regulations.

The results from this survey will be analysed by Early Warning System GmbH's legal department. You will be informed of the findings in due time.
